the Lord God made them all.*

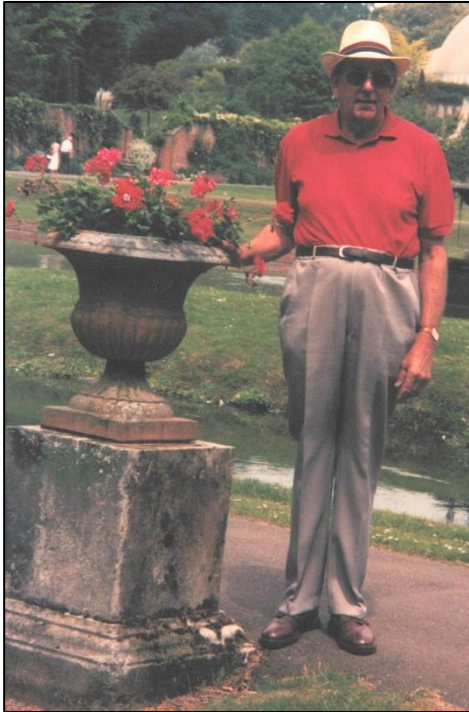
Each little flower that opens,
